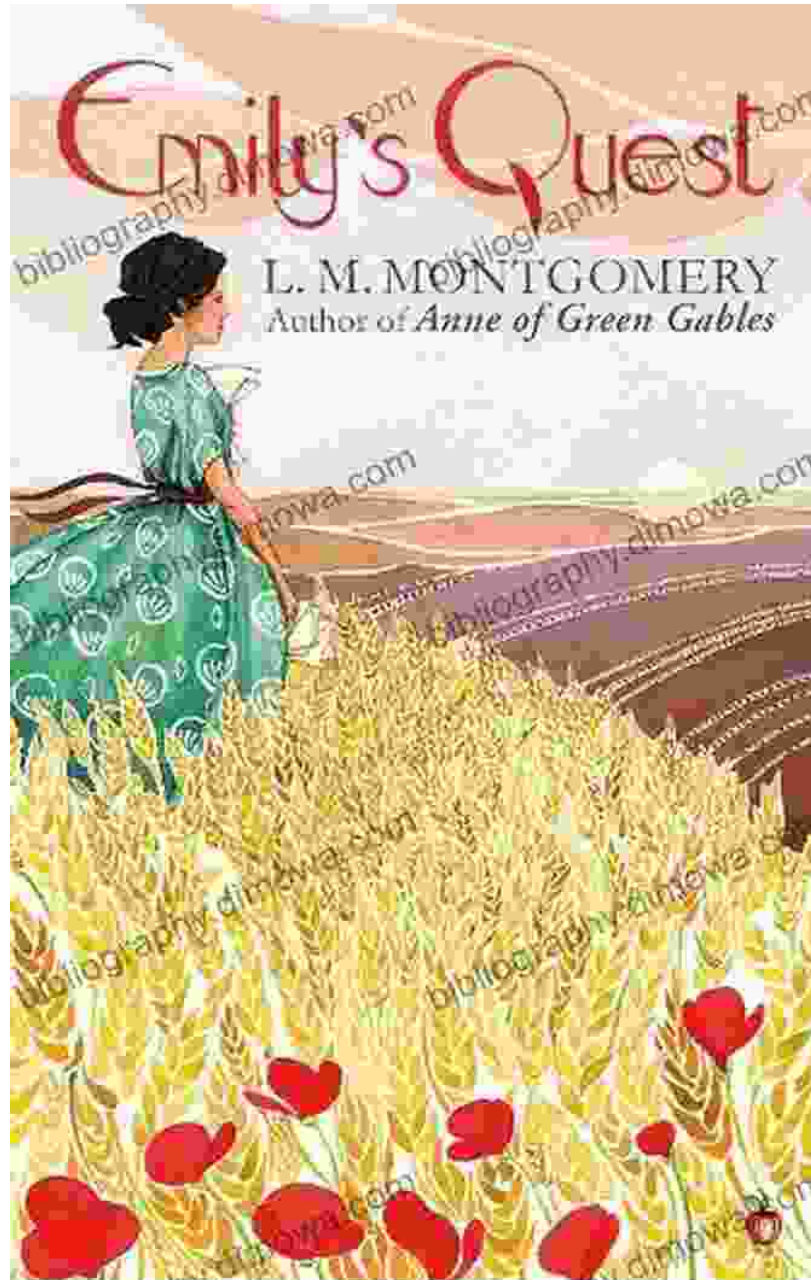


Emily Quest Montgomery: A Pioneering Woman in the American West

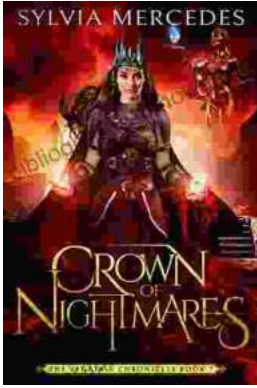
